SETTING, SCHEDULES AND TYPE OF COMPETITION

FRAMEWORK OF THE COMPETITION

The EUROMETROPOLE MASTERS will take place at the Espace Multisports Jean Richmond, inaugurated in March 2013, in Mouvaux (59420), 2 place du cœur de Ville.

The sports area of about 1125m² will allow the establishment of 7 competition surfaces. The dance hall upstairs will open a warm-up area of more than 300 m².

TIMETABLES

- Saturday: start of competition 9am, forecast end 6pm
- Sunday: start of competition 9am, forecast end 2pm

Schedules may vary depending on the number of competitors registered.

TYPE OF COMPETITION

International Individual Open Competition for Veterans.
Excellence Label of the FFJDA since the 2016 edition.

COMMITMENT

The amount of the commitment is set at 20 €, for all commitments before 31 December 2021. Between 1 January and 17 January 2022, the amount of the commitment will be 30 €. No registration will be taken between January 18 and the date of the competition, no registration on site on the day of the competition. No registration can be refunded. However, any medically justified package before 17/01/22, by mail or email, will result in the registration offered for the next edition.

Online registration:

Online registration is mandatory, via the website of the Northern Judo Committee and the Helloasso application.

Registration will only be considered final upon receipt of payment.

SPORTS REGULATIONS

General Regulations: The sporting regulations are, in essence, those of the International Judo Federation. Some specificities have been added, depending either on the rules of the FFJDA, or on the rules specific to the organizer.

1. Conditions of participation

Each federation affiliated to the International Judo Federation can register as many athletes as it wishes through its clubs, as long as the conditions of engagement are respected. An athlete can only participate in one weight category and one age category. Groupings may, however, be decided by the organizer, depending on the number of participants.

Fighters must have at least two years of license and at least hold the Green Belt on the day of the competition.

Each judoka competes in their age category, determined by their year of birth.

Combatants with dual nationality may represent only one country.

Fighters who have participated in an official international competition IFJ (excluding Masters) during the previous 2 seasons will not be able to participate.

Examples:

- Fighters must no longer be 30 years old on the day of the competition: *an athlete born on 31/12/1992 can participate in the 2022 edition; he (she) will be M1 (or F1)*
- It is the calendar year that counts, not the anniversary date: *an athlete born on 31/12/1987 will be entered in the M2 (or F2) category, even if he is 34 years old on 22/01/2022.*

3. Weight categories

Women

-48 kg; -52 kg; -57 kg; -63 kg; -70 kg; -78 kg; +78 kg

Men

-60 kg; -66 kg; -73 kg; -81 kg; -90 kg; -100 kg; +100 kg

Possible groupings: see 6. Competition formula

4. Outfits

• Judogis:

Blue judogis are accepted and even encouraged, to replace the red belt.

Any brand is allowed, as long as the judogi meets the dress standards.

Attention: judogis controls will be possible.

• Bibs:

If the organizer distributes sponsors' bibs to the athletes, they will be given with accreditation and must be worn during the competition. The official FIJ or UEJ bibs can stay on the judogi, these bibs being glued underneath.

• Rings

Judokas are asked to remove their rings, including their wedding rings. In case of non-compliance, HANSOKU MAKE.

5. Competition formula

- from 4 to 5 fighters: pool
- 6 fighters: 2 pools of 3, the first two of each pool qualified for the semi-finals
- 7 fighters: 1 pool of 4 and 1 pool of 3, the first two of each pool qualified for the semi-finals
- more than 7 fighters: double-drafted table
- for 1, 2 or 3 athletes: the organization reserves the right to make coherent groupings of age and/or weight categories, favoring those by the nearest age category

6. Order of passage of categories

The order of passage of the age categories is likely to change according to registrations.

Schedules will be given to athletes, according to their category:

- Saturday, January 22:
 - 9:00 am: M4
 - 10:30 am: M3
 - 12:00 pm: M2
 - 13h30 : M1
 - 3:00 pm: All women (F1 to F11)
- Sunday, January 23:
 - 9:00 am: M5
 - 10:00 am: M6 to M11

7. Golden score rules

The Golden score will be used in case of a tie. It will be unlimited for categories F1/M1 to F6/M6. The maximum duration will be 1 minute for categories F7/M7 to F11/M11.

8. Rank/Championship Relationship

The grade-championship relationship will be applied, in accordance with the official federal texts (CF " Rules of leisure competitions »).

For fighters of the Hauts-de-France League, points can be scored on the spot, if agreed by the regional representative of the Regional Organizing Committee of Ranks (CORG).

For French fighters from leagues outside Hauts-de-France, the heads of the Regional Organizing Committees of Grades (CORG) will approach the FFJDA

website, to extract the results tables as soon as they are published, for the validation of points.

For foreigners, the heads of the Organizing Committee of the Grades of the country concerned will approach the FFJDA website, to extract the results tables as soon as they are published to validate the points, if their federation authorizes it.

WEIGHING AND CONTROLS

- Reminder: no registration, no weighing on D-Day!
- Weighing hours:
 - For categories that fight on Saturday: : Weighed on Friday from 6pm to 9pm at the Jean Richmond space in Mouvaux.
 - For categories that fight on Sundays: : Weigh-in on samedi from 4 pm to 6 pm at the Jean Richmond space in Mouvaux.
 - It will be imperative to respect the time slots of the weighing.
- **No weight tolerance**
- Documents to be submitted to the control:

For the French, the same conditions required under the FFJDA (identity document (passport or identity card, no driver's license), passport with 2 license stamps including that of the current season and medical certificate of less than one year, authorizing the practice of judo in competition)

For foreigners: they must provide any proof to demonstrate that they are in good standing with their Federation : compulsorily affiliated to the International Judo Federation, that they have at least two years of practice, that they are at least ceinture verte and that they are medically fit for competition; in the absence of presentation of a medical certificate, they fight under their full personal responsibility

A single fighter will not be admitted to participate if he cannot prove that he belongs to a club affiliated to his Federation, itself affiliated to the International Federation (UEJ or IFJ).

Insurance: : each combattant is required to take out civil liability and personal injury insurance himself, if he has not already taken it out within the framework of his Federation, either through his affiliated club or through the federal insurance license. The organizers decline all responsibility

Image rights, insurance, medical certificate and regulations: The agreement is made only online at the time of registration; thank you to tick the box that is worth signature,, otherwise, the athlete will not be able to participate.

ATTESTATION OF IMAGE RIGHTS, INSURANCE, MEDICAL CERTIFICATE AND REGULATIONS

IMAGE RIGHTS:

During events organized by the Northern Judo Committee or its Masters Commission, the image and voice of the participants are likely to be captured by any video means as part of the competitions and ancillary activities. The signatory of this form authorizes the Northern Judo Committee and its Masters Commission to carry out image and voice recordings and to use and disseminate, for the promotion of the discipline practiced, the images and voice thus captured, on any audiovisual communication medium whatsoever and in particular: website of the Northern Judo Committee or its Masters Commission, video broadcasts, sports news television, judo tv, social networks. This authorization is granted for the promotion of the North Judo Committee and its Masters Commission free of charge for a period of 70 years and applies to the whole world.

INSURANCE AND MEDICAL CERTIFICATE:

For the French, the signatory certifies that he is licensed with the FFJDA, insured and in possession of a medical certificate attesting that there is no contraindication to the practice of Judo including in competition for the 2021/2022 season.

For foreigners, the signatory certifies that he is licensed with the national federation of his country of origin, insured and in possession of a medical certificate attesting that there is no contraindication to the practice of judo including in competition for the 2021/2022 season.

ACCREDITATIONS, COACHING, AWARDS AND MEDALS

Accreditations, coaching

Each competitor will be awarded an accreditation, during the weigh-in, the day before the competition.

Accreditation will be required during the competition, to access the warm-up area or, at the call of the fighter's name, the competition area. Attention, in 2022, it will be necessarily recovered by the organization at the entrance to the competition area and must be taken back by the fighter at the end of his fight, at the exit; no athlete will be able to present himself to fight if he has not recovered his accreditation at the exit.

Only one coach will be allowed per athlete in the competition area, he will present himself with the athlete and leave the competition zone with the athlete at the end of the fight.

A single coach badge will be sent at the reception to the club representative, for 5 athletes.

Awards and medals

Awards (in the form of prizes, not bonuses) for the podium of each category:

- The first 4 as part of the tables(1st,2nd and two3rd),from 6 fighters,
- The first 3 in the framework of pools(1st,2nd and 3rd), between 2 and 5 fighters.

The 4th of the group is then not considered as second3rd.

If a fighter is alone in his category, he will not be able to be rewarded with a prize. On the other hand, he is considered the winner of his category and will be awarded the gold medal.

Under certain conditions *, medals may be accumulated by a fighter, as part of the groupings, but not the prizes.

* only athletes "aggrieved" by the group will be able to accumulate medals, as examples:

- in a group of 4 M5-66kg athletes with an M5-60kg athlete, the -60kg athlete will obtain the gold medal of his category, being alone, plus that of the grouping, if he finishes in the top 3 of the grouping; on the other hand, the athletes -66kg of the podium, will be able to receive only one medal, although it is a grouping

- in a group of 6 athletes, including 3 F1-57kg athletes and 3 F2 -57kg athletes, only F2 women will be able to accumulate medals, i.e. the 3 medals in their category + the medal of the podium of the grouping, if they climb on the podium.
